This is likely an archaeological site which relates to the early european occupation of Melbourne. It is significant as a record of a relatively later Melbourne subdivision in response to the effects of the goldrush.

Interpretation of Site

Adjacent excavations at 192 A'Beckett Street uncovered a wall feature that previously extended into the address, but is cut by modern footings. Although the Melbourne clay level is shallow, footings of the previous buildings including Landell's 1860s property are likely to survive.

#### History

- 1852- Outside the City of Melbourne northwest expansion
- 1858- subdivided along with the A'Beckett Street allotments
- 1866- James Landell's built a 5-room house and workshop of stone and brick
- 1873- Lily Landells built 2 two-storey terraces, possibly on the previous house footings
- 1959- replaced by current building.
