What is significant?

A single Pepper Tree located on the nature strip in a residential area.

How is it significant?

This Pepper Tree is significant for landscape reasons at the Regional level.

Why is it significant?

This Pepper Tree is significant for its contribution to the landscape. Pepper Trees of this size are not common in the Mornington Peninsula and this particular tree is a landmark in the local community. It also provides habitat for the local birds and due to its large canopy, the tree provides shade in the residential area.
