STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

132 Yarra Street has architectural significance at a local level. It is representative and reasonably intact example of Victorian housing with typical Victorian details. The building retains its characteristic sitin and form has a slate roof, and corrugated iron concave verandah featuring slender iron columns. The building forms part of the

residential streetscape.

Physical Description 1

DESCRIPTION:

This reasonably intact semi-detached Victorian building with timber skillion at the rear, has a symmetrical facade constructed of rendered brick walling. The slate roof is hipped with a corrugated iron concave verandah featuring slender iron Corinthian columns, a fine iron frieze, and brackets. The windows are typically Victorian, double hung sash openings with projecting sills. The building is sited with the verandah to the footpath and forms part of the residential streetscape.
