STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

181 Yarra Street has architectural significance at a local level. It is a typical example of Federation style residence with a high degree of integrity. The building retains its characteristic siting and form, as well as a

number of notable details including a Federation style return timber verandah. Art Nouveau curvilinear fretwork and a timber fence and hedge

Physical Description 1

DESCRIPTION:

181 Yarra Street is an unusual Federation style residence with a high degree of integrity. The building is a detached, single storey structure and features a prominent front gable protruding from a steep hip roof. The asymmetrical timber facade has notable windows with thin outer architraves and a side entrance with a lead light glass door. A federation style return timber verandah with circular posts, wall shingles on the valance, and Art Nouveau curvilinear fretwork provide the decoration. Other details include timber brackets, and a half timbered effect in the gable. Red brick chimneys with rendered mouldings protrude from the roof. The timber framed wire fence with a substantial hedge enhances the presentation of the houses in the streetscape.
