### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Hausen-Halle former Connewarre Memorial Hall building at 1280 Barwon Heads Road is **aesthetically** significant at a LOCAL level. Although relocated, it demonstrates original design qualities of an interwar Public style. These qualities include the dominant gable roof form, horizontal weatherboard wall cladding, timber framed pivot windows with transoms and mullions, wide eaves and the decorative gable infill (ventilators, battening, panelling and brackets). The substantial pine trees contribute to the significance of the place.

The Hausen-Halle former Connewarre Memorial Hall building at 1280 Barwon Heads Road is **historically** significant at a LOCAL level. It has been associated with the Connewarre community as a public hall and memorial to soldiers killed in action in the First World War.

The Hausen-Halle former Connewarre Memorial Hall building at 1280 Barwon Heads Road is **socially** significant at a LOCAL level. It is still recognised by some sections of the community as a memorial to soldiers killed in the First World War.

## Physical Description 1

The former Connewarre Hall at 1280 Barwon Heads Road is located on a substantial site with a deep front setback. Some early pine trees are also situated on the site, together with an interwar Californian Bungalow house, also relocated to this site and altered. The single storey, horizontal weatherboard, interwar Public styled building is characterised by a dominant gable roof form, clad in corrugated zincalume. Wide overhangs are a feature of the eaves. Early timber framed double hung pivot windows with transoms and mullions are located on the longitudinal sides of the building. Early decorative features of the design include the gable infill brackets, panelling and battening and the ventilator . Description
