### **Physical Description 1**

It is a serenely symmetrical, flat-roofed pavilion, apparently floating above grass level. There is a glazed, gabled skylight, a double porte-cochere with a vaulted skylight between, all on a central axis. At sides are shallow bow windows and inset decks at corners. The effect is classical, almost Palladian. It is clad entirely in powder blue laminate. The interiors are exciting, designed with ingenuity, to integrally display the firm's products, in a generally Post-modern manner.

Other display houses of the same period by Landmark and Fasham Johnson at 28-34 Rosco Drive (1978-87) and Merchant Builders at 4-12 Beverley Hills Drive (1987) and 412-418 Porter Street are smaller and less lavish, having a different purpose. No other work by NTMH Group has been identified in the City.
