What is Significant?

St Mark's Anglican Church at 406 Yarra Road, Wonga Park, a timber, Early English Gothic church.

How is it Significant?

St Mark's Anglican Church, 406 Yarra Road, Wonga Park is of historic, social and aesthetic significance to Manningham City.

Why is it Significant?

Of historic and social significance as one of a small number of public buildings that illustrate the development of the Wonga Park farming and fruit growing district in the 1920s. It has associations with locally important families such as the Toppings and the Fulfords and has played an important role in the development of the Wonga Park community. (RNE criteria A.4, B.2, D.2, H.1)

Of aesthetic (architectural) significance as a representative example of a small timber Early English Gothic style church, which is substantially intact. (RNE criterion E.1)
