### **Statement of Significance**

Last updated on -

"Lilybank" at nos. 12-12A Ormond Road, Ascot Vale, was built in 1899 for John Amess. It is a representative villa of its period, now altered after the Great War and of historic interest (Criterion A) for its capacity to demonstrate the nature of the suburban development on the eastern fringe of Ascot Vale at the time. The aesthetic importance of "Lilybank" (Criterion E) is derived from its apparent early date in the immediate locale, established especially by its unpainted stuccoed surfaces, by its prominence on the Ormond Road entry to Moonee Valley and by its setting on high ground overlooking the red brick retaining wall that has become a local landmark.

# **Physical Description 1**

A formerly asymmetrical late Victorian Boom period villa with later Post Federation addition and second dwelling (?) at the east end. The original portion is distinguished by the cast iron verandah, faceted projecting wing and bluestone plinth, whilst the additions have a rough cast gable end, timber posted verandah, lead lit windows and window hoods and terra cotta cresting to the slate roof.

### Integrity

Condition: Sound. Integrity: High with substantial red brick retaining wall along street front common to neighbouring houses.
