The house at no. 29 Brewster Street, Essendon, was built in 1886-87 for (?) Archibald Brown. It is historically important (Criterion A), as a substantial and early villa in its immediate vicinity whilst the terraced form in its landscaped setting is somewhat incongruous adding diversity to the street.

Physical Description 1

A late Victorian Boom period stuccoed Italianate two storeyed villa, set well back from Brewster Street and having a two storeyed cast iron verandah with wing wall at the west end in the manner of a terraced row. Although the facade has been overpainted, the east facing side wall with two storeyed bay remains in an unpainted state and the west wall is in face brickwork with a later garage.
