The Presbytery is of local architectural and historical significance. The building contributes to the heritage character of Westboume Grove and the prominent siting terminates the axis down Helen Street. Together with the adjacent Church, the Presbytery has served the Catholic community in Northcote over a long period of time.

Physical Description 1

The Presbytery is an Italianate style two-storey building of Flemish bond red brick construction with a return castiron verandah with an elegant concave verandah roof. The hipped slate roofs have bracketed eaves and terracotta ridge cresting and finials. The segmented-arched double-hung sash windows are arranged in pairs and have bluestone sills and cream brick voussoirs. The unusual aspect of the main roofis the terracotta finial and ridge decoration which typifies a later period (c1900-15). The tall red brick chimneys have rendered caps and terracotta pots. The front fence, probably originally timber picket, has been removed and concrete paving added.
