Physical Description 1

BUILDINGS: 304 Upper Heidelberg Road is an inter-War, attic style bungalow of red brick construction with broad gabled roofs and a gabled entrance porch supported on squat, tapered rendered piers. A soldier course runs across the street elevation at window head level, and gable ends infilled with stained shingles. The double-hung windows are grouped together and have leadlight upper sashes. The attic window has a skillion roof.

LANDSCAPE: Overgrown topiary is evident in variegated leaf colours in the front garden. The red brick front fence is not original.
