The Baptist Church is of local architectural significance. The church is a notable example of the free Arts and Crafts Gothic style, distinguished by its unusual corner tower and traceried windows. The tower is a landmark in the local vicinity.

Physical Description 1

Designed in a free interpretation of the Gothic style, the Baptist Church is of red brick construction with a steeply pitched, terracotta shingled gabled roof. Window openings along the side elevations are positioned between stepped buttresses, and have cement rendered hoods, sills and Perpendicular Gothic style tracery. The corner square tower is oriented at 45 degrees to the church, and has an unusual buttressed, copper clad spire. The gable end is infilled with shingles.
