

Architecturally, this is a substantial freestone house which is distinguished by its size (typically there are more small cottages in this group) and wall-material combination. If it is original, the verandah is notable. The house is also a major contributor to the Long Gully precinct.

Historically, Eva appears to have been connected over a long period with mining and the location of this house underscores this, being close to the important Carlisle site (Duncan Street)

Physical Description 1

Double-fronted and built of rubble freestone, the house has a hipped roof, corniced cement-clad chimneys and a convex front verandah with a fretted valance (posts and valance new?). The door is six-panelled, indicating some age, and the symmetrically arranged openings have red brick 'quoins'. The picket fence appears old, but the lych gate is more recent. The stone name and date stone over the door is of note
