Architecturally, the house is typical of early gold field's cottages and is sadly neglected. Its physical link with the important gold fields nearby lends historical significance to the site.

Physical Description 1

Characteristic of early cottages, the twin-gabled roof line reflects at least two stages of development and its siting, facing away from the street, reflects two stages for the street pattern. Rubble stone walling makes up the 'front' and first bay, while brickwork makes up the second. Both wings have side parapets and typically small openings, centred on major wall faces. The roof is corrugated iron, but was probably once shingled. Another gabled wing (the original detached kitchen?) juts out at the back, with a skillion-form verandah providing sheltered access to its rooms. A concave verandah may have been removed from the 'front.'

Integrity

External - The house is a ruinous state, but possibly reclaimable. Parapet and roof parts and front verandah are missing and the rear verandah incomplete. Timber additions have been made at the side and rear. Presumably a picket fence once bounded the front of the site.
