

Statement of Significance

The house at no. 32 Queens Avenue, Carnegie, was built in 1888 and formed one of an identical pair since demolished. It was built for and formed part of a land development scheme undertaken by one of Sir Matthew Davies greup of speculative companies known as the Freehold Investment and Banking Company of Australia Ltd. It is historically and aesthetically important.

It is historically important (Criterion A) as a rare surviving (Criterion B)

It is aesthetically important (Criterion E) as an unusual terraced building form in Glen Eira that stands apart from its neighbours which were built predominantly after the tum of the twentieth century and which is further distinguished by the cast cement ornamentation applied to the central porch.

Physical Description 1

An imposing late Victorian stuccoed Boom period villa having a two storeyed verandah with end walls in the manner of a terrace and unusual cast iron spandrels to the lower level demonstrating the final phase in the popularity of this material as a decorative architectural element. There is a prominent central portico with round arch, balustraded balconette above and unusual radiating foliations to the spandrels. There are curved pedimented terminations to the verandah end walls and the side walls are plain, without windows.

Physical Description 2

Integirty: High, front fence with late Victorian cast ironwork is sympathetic and contributory although appearing to have been relocated to this site at a recent date.

Physical Description 3

Condition: sound
