The former stables at the rear of No. 8 Park Crescent, Caulfield North were built in 1915 for the trainer Sylvester Casey. They are historically significant.

They are historically significant (Criterion A) for their capacity to demonstrate the long standing link between the Victoria Amateur Turf Club and its surrounding residential area, recalling other structures since demolished as well as the extant stables at 30 Booran Road, 1 Bond Street and 29 Reddan Road. This building, together with other extant similar structures, imparts a distinctive character to the locale.

Physical Description 1

A large gable roofed red brick and timber former stables situated at the rear of no. 8 Park Crescent and attached to timber framed quarters (?). There is a loft with doors and pulley beam for loading chaff whilst the stalls (not inspected) have segmental window openings, boarded up, facing the rear lane.
