What is significant? The SEC building and watertank at 64-64B Brunswick Road, Brunswick.

How is it significant? The SEC building and watertank at 64-64B Brunswick Road, Brunswick is of local historic and aesthetic significance to the City of Moreland. Why is it significant?

Of historic significance, as electricity infrastructure which demonstrates the early use and methods of supply of electricity in Brunswick by independent and, later, state agencies. (AHC Criteria A.4 & B.2)

Of aesthetic significance, as a good and intact representative example of an interwar industrial building with fine architectural detailing. (AHC Criterion E.1)

Physical Description 1

The SEC substation at 64-64A Brunswick Road, Brunswick is a two storey symmetrical brick building with a painted stucco finish, built in a 'classical' style and sitting on a basalt block base. Cast iron down pipes and a decorative rain head on the east side of the building have been retained. On its western side, set back from the road, is a water tower raised on rectangular legs and faced with what appears to be sheets of painted metal. A bank of transformers sit toward the front of the water tower. The building and water tank appear to date from the 1920s or 1930s. The building appears to still be in use as it has a sign warning of high voltage on its enclosing fence.
