What is significant?

'Brimin', comprising the house constructed c.1925, front fence and garage at 292 Moreland Road, Brunswick.

How is it significant?

'Brimin' comprising the house constructed c.1925, front fence and garage at 292 Moreland Road, Brunswick is of local aesthetic significance to the City of Moreland.

Why is it significant?

Of aesthetic significance as a good and intact example of the Spanish Mission Revival style, popularised in Australia in the 1920s. The house is complemented by an original front fence as well as its original garage. (AHC Criterion F.1)

Physical Description 1

Located on the high (south) side of Moreland Road on a corner site, the house at 292 Moreland Road is a single storey painted rendered house with a clinker brick plinth and Spanish Mission detailing. It has a clay tile hipped roof, with a entrance wing, which projects to both the south and east elevations. This entrance is capped with clay cordova tiles and has twisted columns and decorative relief mouldings. Chimneys are painted render. The windows to the front facade are double hung multi-pane sashes with round arched uppers. A smaller twisted column terminate the ends of the windows. Wrought iron balustrading in the entrance porch is repeated in the front fence on the southern and eastern boundaries. The front fence has clinker brick piers with painted rendered caps and painted rendered plinths. The house also retains its original garage to the east boundary, which features similar detailing to the main house.
