What is significant?

The house, garage and front fence at 75 Nicholson Street, Coburg.

How is it significant?

The house, garage and front fence at 75 Nicholson Street, Coburg is of local aesthetic significance to the City of Moreland.

Why is it significant?

Of aesthetic significance, as a good representative example of an inter-war brick bungalow which retains many original features, including its garage and perimeter fencing. (AHC Criterion E.1)

Physical Description 1

The house at 75 Nicholson Street, Coburg (on the south-west corner of Rennie Street) is a large clinker brick interwar bungalow with a steeply pitched glazed terracotta tiled gabled roof. The house retains its original clinker brick double garage (doors replaced) and low clinker brick fence and clipped hedge. The house's features include: two tall clinker brick chimneys, attic window in the main body of the roof, decorative brick bracketing terminating the eave line, projecting concrete flat roof entrance, and a mix of window types including multi-pane and double-hung sash as well as mixed plate glass panes.
