What is significant?

The City of Brunswick Electricity Supply transformer station (former)located at 25A Stewart Street, Brunswick.

How is it significant?

The City of Brunswick Electricity Supply transformer station (former)located at 25A Stewart Street, Brunswick is of local historic and aesthetic significance to the City of Moreland.

Why is it significant?

Of historical significance as a representative example of an intact andfunctioning part of the infrastructure supplying Brunswick withelectricity since c.1914. It demonstrates the important role of localCouncils in the supply and distribution of electricity in the periodprior to the formation of the SEC in 1918.

Of aesthetic significance as a representative and intact example of apublic utility building that assists in demonstrating the range of architectural styles used in the construction of substations and similar buildings in Brunswick, and regionally, across Melbourne.

Physical Description 1

The City of Brunswick Electricity Supply transformer station (former) at 2A Connelly Street, Brunswick appears to be one of the oldest and most intact of the exant sub-stations in the municipality. It is constructed in a simple style of red brick with an original timber lintel over the doors, which also appear original. The gabled roof is tiled with terracotta tiles, and the bell cast tower is a rectangular with painted louvres, a similarly aligned gable roof also topped with terracotta tiles, and featuring decorative terracotta finials.

Physical Conditions

25A Stewart Street is in good condition overall, despite evidence of the north wall bowing away to cause cracking, weathering to eaves boards on the roof and (especially) ventilation box. The door is missing louvres.

Integrity

25A Stewart Street has no alterations or additions evident. It retains high integrity.
