What is Significant?

The terrace row, constructed c.1895, at 5-11 Burchett Street, Brunswick.

How is it Significant?

The terrace row at 5-11 Burchett Street, Brunswick is of local aesthetic significance to the City of Moreland.

Why is it Significant?

Of aesthetic significance as an example of a Victorian terrace row which is notable for the unusual lattice work detailing to the parapet, a design not known elsewhere in Brunswick. (AHC Criterion E.1)

Physical Description 1

Nos. 5-11 Burchett Street, Brunswick is a row of four Victorian single storey terrace houses. Originally bi-chrome brick with unpainted rendered parapets, No. 7 is now painted and Nos. 5, 7 and 11 have painted parapets. Only No. 9 retains its original facade. The terraces have a hipped corrugated iron roofed verandah which runs the length of the row. Nos. 5 and 7 retain their original cast iron lacework, however the lacework at Nos. 9 and 11 have been removed. The roof itself is hidden behind an unusual parapet with open lattice work detailing. The centre of each terrace is marked by a section of solid parapet topped by a round arch with decorative relief moulding. The front door is typically four panel with a highlight and the windows are typically double-hung sashes.

The front fences are not original.
