What is significant?

'Arborea', comprising the house constructed by 1929, at 1 Williamson Street, Berwick.

How is it significant?

'Arborea' is of local aesthetic significance to the City of Casey.

Why is it significant?

Aesthetically, 'Arborea' is significant as a fine and intact example of a simple weatherboard Interwar bungalow that retains much of its original external detailing. (AHC criterion E1)
