

Residence - demolished and redeveloped, only garden walls remain. 1842 residence consisted of a large building set in centre of the block with a large garden at the front.

Archaeological Significance

The is archaeologically significant as there is potential for subsurface deposits relating to

the cottage and hotel in less disturbed areas.

Historical Significance The site is of local and regional significance as teh location of early Henty brothers

pastoral farm and cottage, one of the first in Victoria, later a hotel (1879).

History

Site of Edward Henty's 1834 house and farm. Demolished and a timber cottage built in 1842 by S.G. Henty. Licenced as an hotel by William Paramor in 1879. This was demolished in 1963 and the site rebuilt, only the gate and garden wall surviving in good condition.
