Last updated on - August 27, 2007

This man-made island was built for defence purposes in 1879-80 on a sandbank with bluestone rubble shoring. The fortifications include concrete and redgum dugout bunkers, underground tunnels and gun emplacements. The island is also important as one of only two breeding areas in Victoria of the white-faced Storm Petrel (Pelagodromana marina). A small population of Little Penguins can also be found on the island. The sandy soil supports good growths of several species of shrub flora. The island is historically important as well as of significance as a petrel breeding ground. Classified: 30/10/1986
