The Greenlaw Gully is of local landscape significance as open space containing remnant heathland communities and of regional significance for its scientific value.

LOCATION:

Land adjacent to a tributary of the Balcombe Creek in the Greenlaw Estate known as the Norfolk-Hopetoun Flora and Fauna Reserve. Located to the north and south of Norfolk Road near Hopetoun Avenue, Mount Martha.

Extent of Registration

Approximately 6 hectares in area, some 800 metres in length and of width varying from 50 to 200 metres. The largest portion is at the rear of allotments fronting Sherwood Cres and Essex Road, north of Norfolk Road, Mt

Martha. A smaller section of gully extends south of Norfolk Road adjacent to the Mount Martha Municipal Golf Course.
