Sandy Point is of State significance because of its unique terrain and ecological significance and associations with the early coastal exploration of Westernport and the Naval Depot:

- Unique low-lying sandy terrain including numerous multiple dune ridges
- Areas of undisturbed coastal woodland and swamp enclaves not found elsewhere on the Mornington Peninsula
- Illustrating stages in geomorphological evolution and associated vegetation successions
- Association with the French explorer D'Urville who landed on Sandy Point in 1826
- Association with the Naval Depot from 1912.

South of Hann's Inlet, east of South Beach Road and Western Hill, being part of the Commonwealth of Australia (Royal Australian Navy Cerberus Base: restricted area)
