Rare or localised Outstanding size This *Pinus torreyana* is a very large and dominant specimen growing in parkland surrounding the historic "Mooramong" homestead. There are a total of three Soledad Pines of which two are in poor condition. *Pinus torreyana* was one of the rarest pine species in the world in the early 20th century, and is still considered endangered in the United States.

All the other pines are *Pinus radiata*. This tree has a very large circumference and canopy spread and appears to be of similar age to specimens growing at Bendigo, Castlemaine, Warrnambool and Malsmbury Reservoir. Located north-west of the tennis court.
