Historical value

This is an old River Red Gum (*Eucalyptus camaldulensis*) with historical significance. It was the site of the first Catholic mass service held in Wahgunyah in 1869 by Father W Tierney, Parish Priest of Beechworth. A brass plaque detailing this information is attached to the tree.

The tree is located in a road reserve at the end of Short Street.
