## Statement of Significance

Rare or Localised:

A tree of a species or variety that is rare or of very localised distribution.

Planted in 1936, the tree is a fine specimen unusual in cultivation in Victoria. The tree is well-shaped and has developed its typical swollen trunk. It occurs amongst *Brachychiton populneus*, *Grevillea robusta* and *Eucalyptus ficifolia*. The planting has an interesting although somewhat tragic background. The son of the previous owners, Mr & Mrs Bankin, perished on a motorcycle trip to Central Australia in 1936 and the seed was collected from his belongings.

The tree is located at "Alcheringa", Congupna, 8km N-E of Shepparton on the Goulburn Valley Highway.
