This is an impressive specimen of *Sequoia sempervirens* located opposite the kiosk/cafe at front of park. Growth is crowded by the Druids Oak.

It is the only Coast Redwood (*Sequoia sempervirens*) in the Gardens in contrast to the 30 plus Sierra Redwood (*Sequoiadendron giganteum*)

These two species are both native to northern America but occur in totally different environments. *S sempervirens* occurs along the coast of California and *S giganteum* is found inland in the drier areas
