This tree is an unusual form of the species *Ulmus parvifolia*. It retains its bark and does not show the normal characteristics of Chinese Elm which often have attractive peeling bark and a slightly pendulous habit. It is also unlike the Chinese Elm that originated as seedlings from Yarralumba Nursery in Canberra which also retain their bark. This tree is completely deciduous
