An unusual tree in cultivation; native to Southern Mexico, Venezuela and Columbia. One of many plants often referred to as "Stinging Trees" This specimen is the most outstanding of the eight known. It is popular for subtropical gardening style as the young seedling bear very large leaves.

The tree lost a limb as a result of storm damage in October 1987 but has recovered to develop a good form.
