A large outstanding example of this uncommon palm. It is the tallest specimen in Victoria, appearing in early photographs, and a significant feature in the garden of a property having important associations with the wine industry in Victoria.

The garden also contains a number of other palm species: *Trachycarpus fortunei*, *Livistona australis*, *Phoenix canariensis* and *Butia capitata*
