Aesthetic Significance

An outstanding avenue of 16 and a row of 9 trees bordering Chaffey Avenue (formerly Palm Ave), the main access to 'Rio Vista' the original property of WB Chaffey. The trees' uniformity, size and location contribute to the significance of this historic property. A key feature of the Mildura landscape, this species was presumably influenced as a planting by the Chaffey brothers.
