Contribution to landscape

A large specimen covering almost the entire courtyard. Surrounded by buildings on three sides, the tree is a significant landscape feature. Beneath the canopy the root system is covered with hollow bricks and seating is arranged on the southern side of the tree. The tree would benefit from a management program to remove deadwood, crossing limbs and stubs. This elm is an uncommon species in the district with the only other examples being two trees in a private garden in Irymple.
