The dwelling at 88 McCartin Street is of local historic and aesthetic interest to the town of Leongatha.

Historically, it demonstrates the early residential development of Leongatha, and is part of a group of dwellings in McCartin Street that date from 1900 until the post war period.

Aesthetically, it is a substantially intact example of a late Victorian residence and is notable for being one of a pair with No. 86.
