History

Great Extended Hustlers. This company, the greatest on the Hustler's line, was formed in 1865, and at that time it included all claims on Hustler's Hill, except Latham & Watsons. During 1870 this mine yielded 18,209 oz. of gold from 13,998 tons crushed and paid £63,700 in dividends before June of 1871. By 1880 this company had obtained 144,719 oz. of gold and paid £363,000 in dividends. Payable reefs were later found at 1860 feet (in 1887), and at 2,840 feet (in 1898) after sinking through hundreds of feet of unproductive country. *This place/object may be included in the Victorian Heritage Register pursuant to the Heritage Act 2017.
