History

Heritage Inventory History of Site: Porcupine Inn established here by Hawkins in 1846. Destroyed by fire and new brick and stone premises erected in 1852. The discovery of gold in Bendigo Creek was reported announced here in 1851. It became an important stopping place on the road to Bendigo in the 1850s and a police cell and barracks ere erected, along with stables and kitchen gardens. From 1860 it became a boarding house until abandoned in 1934. In 1971 the Country Roads ?Board bulldozed the surviving structures.
