Statement of significance

The Sydney Road Bridge punt is of historical and archaeological significance as an unusual, and well preserved example of early river craft in Victoria. The punt is associated with the historic Sydney Road Bridge (H0092).

VHR history

The wreck may be the remains of the punt which the Victorian Government began operating at the site of the Sydney Road bridge in 1853. The punt was replaced by the first timber bridge in 1862.
