The wooden steamer Genista was built in Sydney in 1886 and operated

by Howard Smith and Co to the Western

by Port Steamship Company to serve as the local ferry in Western

Port,

br /> travelling between Stony Point and Phillip Island. In 1906 Genista

br /> stranded near Hastings, and was salvaged and returned to service. In

br /> 1920 Genista was sold to the newly created Westernport

Steamship Company

br /> and continued to work in the bay until the 1930s. In 1935 Genista sank

br /> at its moorings on the landward side of the dolphin at Rhyll while being

br /> dismantled. Part of the vessel was exposed at low tide until 1966 when

br /> Ports and Harbours removed the boiler and used explosives on the wreck

br /> to flatten it.
