Whaler wrecks in Victoria are very rare, the only unknown whaler recorded is a French whaler (S801) reportedly wrecked at Cape Nelson near Portland.

The earliest historical accounts of whaling in Victoria date to the 1830s. In Gippsland, temporary whaling stations extended along the coast from Western Port Bay to Mallacoota and Gabo Island (Morwell Historical Society 1975).
