Cause of loss

Propellor shaft broke, piercing the hull, causing the vessel to sink stern first.

VHR history

The City of Hobart was an iron steamer built for the Tasmanian Steam Navigation Company for use in the intercolonial passenger and cargo trade. Towards the end of its working life, it was reduced to carrying coal. On a voyage from Newcastle to Melbourne the propellor shaft broke and is thought to have pierced the hull, the vessel sinking soon afterwards.
