## **VHR** history

On 2 February 1857 the schooner Coila bound from Sydney to Melbourne and<br/>
on the East Spit, Corner Inlet VIC near where<br/>
br/> the steamer Clonmel had been lost in 1840. Her cargo of ale, porter<br/>
br/> sugar and tea was thrown overboard but she remained imbedded about six<br/>
br/> feet in the sane. The vessel brought 50 pounds when auctioned several<br/>
br/> weeks later and the cargo released 62 pounds.
