This is not the Corio built in 1854 in Greenock, Scotland sister ship to SS Ant (1866) which was wrecked near Wollongong (NHSD ID 1182).<br/>br /> <br /> Scuttled 9/2/1939 (Arnott T., 19/9/94, pers comms). Record made in the Hydrographic Surveyors Diary of sinking, date and position (Larken, P., 1939) and is also noted on the Comudive Chart (Smith A., 1991) of wrecks around Port Phillip Heads.
