Statement of significance

Schooners of this type traded between Hobart, Port Phillip and Port Albert. Cargos were usually typical of the small vessels operating in this trade. Namely; From Port Albert - Cattle and sheep and from Hobart either sundries or ballast for Port Albert.

VHR history

The schooner Dew Drop was one of the many sailing vessels lost on the dangerous bar at Port Albert in the early years of settlement. Typical of these vessels, the Dew Drop was engaged in the cattle trade with Tasmania.
