## VHR history

The schooner Eleanor Johnstone was lost on Gabo Island while attempting to reach shelter from a westerly gale. The lighthouse keeper at Gabo Island reported that the schooner had gone ashore on the Island and was a total wreck. All crew saved. Master censured by Steam Navigation Board. <br/>

The vessel traded regularly to the Gippsland Lakes and was carrying a cargo of bark at the time of its loss.<br/>
-> The Eleanor Johnstone had previously stranded on the Lakes Entrance bar in April 1874 (Gippsland Times 25/4/1874) and in March 1879 (Bairnsdale Advertiser xx March 1879) but was refloated on both occasions.
