At anchor at Sandridge Town Pier, broke away from moorings and broke up beach. Wreckage strewn on the beach with only a few upright posts visible from the beach

VHR history

The schooner Ellen and Mary broke away from moorings at Sandridge Town Pier, stranded on the nearby beach, and rapidly broke up. The beach was strewn with wreckage. Only a few upright posts were visible from beach. Auctioned 22 July 1876 by James Lukey - 'vessel and everything belonging to her, whether on board or on shore.' . Register closed 31 July 1876. Previously wrecked 25 March 1861 at Tamar Heads on Sheer Reef but refloated. In 1851, traded between Circular Head, Launceston, Melbourne carrying passengers, horses, carts, sheep, potatoes, apples. In 1854 made a voyage from Launceston to Port Fairy carrying timber. In 1860s carried wool and ballast to Melbourne.
