The cutter Emily left Eden for Mallacoota but disappeared during rough weather, taking the lives of the two crew members.
 The vessel's dingy and a man's cap were washed up at Tullaberga Island near Cape Howe. "It is supposed that this vessel foundered during the recent heavy weather. Nothing has been seen of crew or wreckage, excepting that a boat belonging to the cutter was picked up between Mallacoota and Gabo Island."
