# **VHR** history

The steam hopper barge Fawkner was built as an auxiliary unit of the Victorian Navy, and could be armed with a six inch gun and two Gattling guns. It was fitted with a magazine, had an armoured engine room and was later fitted with a compressor to act as a tender for the navy's torpedo boats. Apart from its usual dredging operations, it served as a non-commissioned minesweeper in 1914. After it had outlived its usefulness, the Fawkner was scuttled in 1935.
