Wheat and barley. 700 bags of wheat, 140 flour - 1/2 of each damaged by salt water

## **Master**

Captain Noon

## **Weather conditions**

Fierce SE gale

## **Cause of loss**

Anchors parted during gale and was blown ashore near jetty. She was later refloated and then again went ashore becoming a total wreck.

## **VHR history**

After loading a cargo of wheat, barley and flour for Sydney, the schooner Freedom was driven ashore at Warrnambool by a south easterly gale. Although refloated, another gale drove the vessel ashore again, this time it became a total wreck.
